Summary of CDWR Grant Program Solicitations and Schedules

California Department of Water Resources (CDWR) provided a presentation to the Roundtable of Regions on March 20, 2012, in Sacramento (w/ WebEx)¹. Proposition 84 IRWM Implementation Grant and Proposition 1E Stormwater Flood Management (SWFM) Grant schedules and CDWR review process were described. CDWR put the presentation online and released *preliminary dates* for the grant programs.² The dates are subject to change by CDWR in their revised Guidelines and final Proposal Solicitation Package (PSP) for the IRWMP and SWFM grants.

For IRWM Implementation Grant Round 2, a one step process will be used. This means that the grant application and list of projects will be reviewed along with an IRWMP Content Review using CDWR standards, but CDWR will not evaluate and score the Imperial IRWMP. A two step process will be used for Round 3, which means that for Round 3 the Imperial IRWMP will first be reviewed and scored, and then projects will be reviewed and scored to make CDWR funding decisions. The final PSPs will define the CDWR project selection process.
